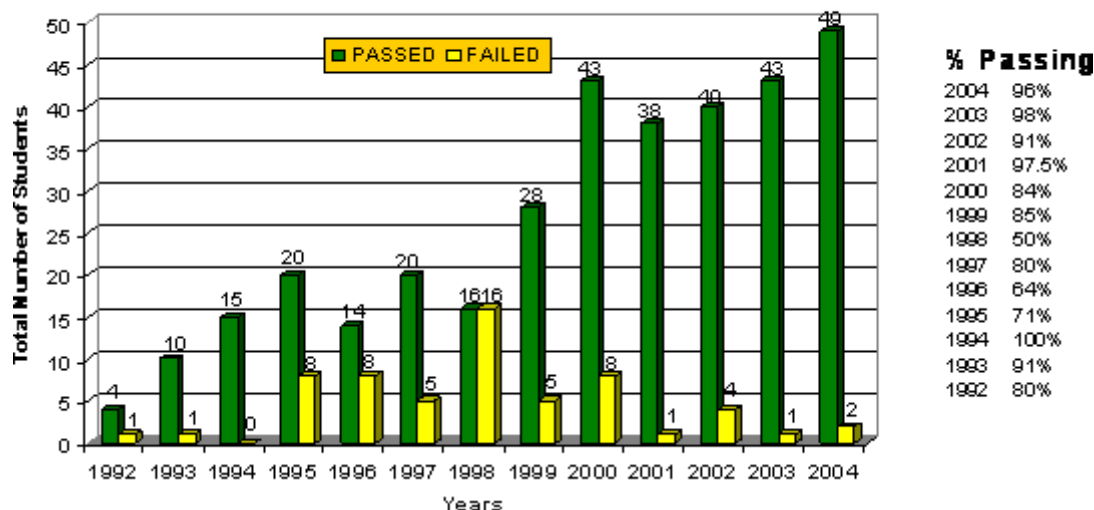


## IB Results 1992 - 2004

### AWTY STUDENTS CONTINUE TO EXCEL

Once again, Awty students excelled on the International Baccalaureate final exams taken this past Spring. Forty-nine out of 51 students passed the rigorous, externally assessed exams.

Since it began requiring the program in 1996, Awty has seen the number of students passing the intensive exams increase by 20%. Individual exams are graded on a scale of 1 to 7 and scores of 5 or above earn students placement in first tier universities, as well as allow the students to receive college credit or advanced placement at many institutions.

This year, Awty students earned an average of 5.16 points on individual tests. Overall, most of the average scores of each individual test taken by Awty students were above the world wide average. The students also earned an average of 32 out of 45 possible cumulative exam points, with four students achieving a mark of 38 or higher. These students will be attending top universities this fall such as Brown University , McGill University , Rice University , and University of Warwick .

“This is a first class performance by both students and faculty,” stated Dr. David Watson, Head of School. “The fact that I.B. examinations are externally moderated by examiners in many countries around the world gives added currency to the achievements of our students in gaining such creditable results.”

The International Baccalaureate Organization’s diploma program is a demanding college-prep course of study that is recognized worldwide. The grading system is criterion referenced in that each student’s performance is measured against well-defined levels of achievement consistent from one examination level to the next. Of the three schools in Houston offering the program, Awty is the only private school and the only school requiring students to take the full diploma program in order to graduate.
